Dear Ms. Joiner and the Dunkirk City Council:

Our union, 1199SEIU United Healthcare Workers East, represents the technical, clerical, service and maintenance workers of Brooks Memorial Hospital who have been in contract negotiations with management since March 11. Although we plan to continue to bargain in good faith, we feel that the hospital, now affiliated with the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center, is intentionally stalling our negotiations by putting forth contract proposals that they know are unacceptable to our membership. We believe that the hospital's ultimate goal is to end inpatient care at the hospital and continue forward as an urgent care center.

As members of this community we realize the negative impact that turning our hospital into an urgent care center would have on our city both with regards to access of care and the loss of good jobs for many of our neighbors. That is why we are requesting your permission to hold a 'Community Rally to Save Our Hospital' at Washington Park on Thursday, August 7 at 5:00pm following our informational Picket in front of the hospital from 2pm - 5pm.

We would like to invite our local elected officials and members of the community to learn more about the obstacles we face in contract negotiations and inform them of the potential negative outcomes that may result if we no longer have access to inpatient hospital care in our area. We also want to stress the importance of maintaining these good jobs in our community. The fact is that the loss of good jobs is plaguing Western New York and has been especially devastating to the Dunkirk area. It is becoming more difficult for working people to stay here, find good jobs, and contribute to our local economy.

Please review our request to rally at Washington Park on August 7 at your earliest convenience. We look forward to hearing from you soon.



This letter is to advise your department in writing of a dead tree on the Gazelle St. side of our home located at 165 Lake Shore Dr E. The tree is the second one from the corner located between the sidewalk and the street. A photo of the tree is enclosed. As you can see from the photo the tree no longer gets leaves and the bark is falling off of it. Branches consistently fall out of the tree during high winds. A large branch broke off during a winter storm with high winds, ripping phone and electric wires from our home.

We have contacted your office on four occasions, the last being two weeks ago at which time we requested a call back to let us know what was decided in regards to this tree. As of today we have received no phone call back. In addition to our own calls we were told by a representative from the National Grid tree trimming crew that was in the area that they had contacted the City to notify them that the tree was a hazard.
