A Note From the Coordinators

Dear Members:

Summer is here and activities are in full swing. We are hoping for a better market season which started on Wednesday, June 17. The market manager has secured funds for a new gazebo to be erected on our grounds. We hope you come on any Wednesday to enjoy a hot dog, check out the vendors, and relax while you socialize and enjoy your Center. Farmer's Market senior coupons will be distributed at the Center on Wednesday, July 15 from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Big Bingo has been successful. We have been getting a perfect crowd of about 60 people each month. Future games will be held on July 15, August 12 and September 9.

The travel schedule continues to a variety of destinations. The July 7 Allegany Casino run is completely booked and the Erie Getaway Boat trip is $\frac{3}{4}$ full with some seats still available. The price of this day long trip is \$60.00. Stops will be made at St. Patrick's Church, the Golden Corral Buffet and Presque Isle Casino.

We have confirmed another trip to the Allegany Casino on Thursday, August 13. The price is \$25.00, which includes a \$20.00 free slot play and \$5.00 food voucher. Sign ups will begin on Tuesday, June 30. The 4-day, 3-night Atlantic City annual trip will complete our August travel. We continue to work hard on a mystery trip in the fall, a visit to Letchworth State Park and a return trip to Batavia Downs.

If you are planning into the future we have booked an overnight stay at the Hampton Inn in Pittsburgh for Sunday, October 10 - returning Monday, October 11. Stops will be made at the Rivera Casino, the Meadowlands and Presque Isle with a total of \$80.00 in slot bonuses. A complimentary breakfast will be available on Monday morning.
